ABSTRACT STRUCTURE - please adhere to these rules
Language:
Abstracts should be submitted in English only.
Title:
Do not use capital letters.
Authors:
Author and co-authors first names and family names (e.g. Marcus Smith); there is no limit on the authors allowed
Affiliation:
Affiliation details of all authors must contain :
Institution/Hospital, Department, City, Country
<u>Abstract body</u> : The body of the abstract must be uploaded as text document and is limited to 300 words (title, authors and tables/figures do not count), and must in black & white.
If relevant for your submission, organize it as follows:
Background:
A statement of the purpose and the hypothesis of the study.
Methods:
A concise description of the methods used.
Results:
A summary of the results presented in just enough detail to support the conclusions.
Conclusions:
A statement of the conclusions reached based on the presented data.
Tables/Figures:
A maximum of three (3) is possible and must be submitted separately (jpg, gif, png or jpeg are acceptable

formats). As a rule the table/figure is placed after the results.



Other:

Use only standard abbreviations. Use generic names of drugs. Express numbers as numerals.

ABSTRACT WORD LIMIT: 300

WRITTEN CONSENT:

No publication of patient data without written consent.

PREVIOUSLY PUBLISHED ABSTRACTS

Please note that the previously published manuscripts/abstracts/presentations cannot be submitted again.

<u>YOUNG SWISS NEPHROLOGY AWARD:</u> Abstracts submitted by YSN authors (< 40 years old) can apply to participate in the "Young Swiss Nephrology Award": please, mention"YES" as a "Student Paper" & the first author will be asked to mention his/her date of birth. The 4 best papers will have the possibility to present their work as Oral Presentation during the YSN Session. One of them will be awarded "Young (<40 yo) Swiss Nephrology Award 2024" with a prize money award

ORAL or POSTER:

The choice of format is determined by the Scientific Committee (long oral presentation, power pitch AND Poster presentation, elevator pitch format, Pecha-Kucha storytelling), Poster presentation. This will be duly explained in the notification of acceptance.

PRESENTATIONS

Long Oral presentation

The time slot for classical oral presentation is 10 minutes (8-minute presentation and 2-minute discussion).

Short Oral presentation

The short oral presentation is designated to stimulate the discussion on posters. Each speaker will present the essence of his work in 3-minute presentation, followed by 2-minute discussion. **The abstracts selected for this session will be also presented as classical printed-out posters**. The poster format is DIN A0 (120cm x 85cm) (height x width). The best poster will be awarded with a dedicated prize.

Elevator pitch format

Selected case reports will be presented in the **"elevator pitch" format**, an innovative, dynamic presentation format aiming at the active interaction with the public. The first part of all authors will have 1 minute to present 1 slide to convince the jury (= audience) of the quality of their work, in order to be selected for the second part and the presentation of additional 5-minute presentation (+ 2min-discussion).

Pecha-Kucha storytelling format (YSN best oral presentation)

Selected abstracts for the YSN Best Oral Presentation will be presented in the innovative **Pecha-Kucha storytelling format.** The presentation consists of 20 slides (exactly 20) and each slide must be shown for 20 seconds. The slides will be shown on auto-advancing mode, i.e. the presenter cannot determine the timing of the slide progression and it is not allowed to introduce additional animation within the slide. Presenting in the Pecha Kucha style is a challenge: a strong presentation is well planned, organized and edited. If you are not familiar with this presentation style, we recommend you to get additional information (more about this format: www.pechakucha.com/about).

The best presentations will be awarded with a <u>dedicated prize</u>. The prizes will be awarded at the aperitif before the networking dinner on 05.12.2024 from approx. 19.00 hrs. **The presence of the winners is desired.**
